### Amanda Nevill, BFI CEO,

Amanda joined the British Film Institute in 2003. She has led a transformation, creating an internationally influential organisation. In 2011 the BFI became the lead body for film in the UK. Its new strategy, 'Film Forever', covers the cultural, creative and economic aspects of film, with emphasis on education and nurturing the next generation of filmmakers and audiences, and with the aim of underpinning a flourishing

film culture and a prosperous industry. Under Amanda's leadership the BFI has pioneered the development of the BFI Player – a video-on-demand platform for British, archive and international film.



Mark Linsey, Director, BBC Studios

Mark was appointed to head BBC Studios in March 2016, having previously been Acting Director, Television; Controller, Entertainment Commissioning; and Deputy Director, Television. He has been responsible for Strictly Come Dancing, The Apprentice, Michael McIntyre's Comedy Road Show, The Voice, Top Gear, The Graham Norton Show, Have I Got News For You, Comic Relief, The Revolution Will Be Televised and Russell Howard's Good News Show.
