**EXECUTIVE COUNCIL VACANCIES 2017 - revised**

Could you play a leading role in helping to run your trade union? Following the WGGB Annual General Meeting on 13 September, a few vacancies remain on our Executive Council (EC). This is an invitation to members to stand for one of the empty seats.

The following regional seats are vacant – London and South East, East Midlands, North West (Merseyside), North West (Manchester), South West (Devon & Cornwall) and Yorkshire & North East, plus, one craft sector seat – Videogames. It is vital for the vacancies to be filled if the EC is to be truly representative of all members of the WGGB. It is possible for two members to “job-share” an EC seat.

To be eligible, you need to have been a Full Member of the WGGB for at least two years continuously prior to the date on which nominations close, or else you need to be a Life Member. You also need a proposer and seconder, who must be Full Members of the WGGB in good standing. Those elected will serve for a three-year term.

Members of the Executive Council attend about six meetings per year at which they formulate WGGB policy and take decisions about collective agreements, membership and financial matters, and other issues of importance to working writers. Members attending EC meetings can claim expenses for their travel, meals, and, if necessary, overnight accommodation.

## Notes for candidates

If the number of eligible candidates is the same or fewer than the number of vacancies in each category, the candidates will be elected unopposed.

If the number of eligible candidates is greater than the number of vacancies in any category, a postal ballot of relevant Guild members will be organised in accordance with Guild rules and trade union legislation.

In the event of a ballot the following arrangements will apply:

- Each candidate will be invited to submit an election statement not exceeding 250 words. Any candidate who exceeds the word limit will be asked to shorten the statement to the required length, failing which the statement will be cut short at or about the 250<sup>th</sup> word.
- In addition to the statement, each candidate will be invited to submit a list of professional writing credits, plus a list of any Guild posts currently or previously held.
- The election statements, etc., will be circulated to all candidates, and each candidate will be invited to submit in response a statement, not exceeding 100 words, of rebuttal or clarification. Any candidate who exceeds the word limit will be asked to shorten the statement to the required length, failing which the statement will be cut short at or about the 100<sup>th</sup> word. *While there is no Guild rule preventing the separate circulation of election material, it is hoped that this provision will make it unnecessary for candidates or their supporters to do so, as such activity has caused controversy in the past.*
- Ballot papers, election statements, etc., will be sent to each Guild member eligible to vote, along with a reply-paid envelope. All ballots or unopposed elections will be conducted and/or supervised by Electoral Reform Services Ltd, the Independent Scrutineer appointed by the Guild for this purpose.

It is intended to conduct these elections strictly in accordance with the Rules of the Writers' Guild and the relevant trade union legislation. The Guild Rule Book can be downloaded from our website ([www.writersguild.org.uk](http://www.writersguild.org.uk)) and paper copies can be obtained from the Guild office.
