

The RIGHTS Card

What all playwrights are entitled to

WGGB has legally binding agreements with the National Theatre, the RSC and the Royal Court (the Theatres National Committee, TNC) and with the subsidised building-based theatres, and some subsidised touring companies (UK Theatre, UKT).

These are minimum terms agreements, meaning that no contract can be less favourable to the playwright (though writers can negotiate better terms).

These KEY RIGHTS apply to all plays premiered by TNC and UKT theatres, and to *all* playwrights, old or young, emergent or established, famous or unknown.

- I. Companies must use the agreement in any of their theatre spaces. They cannot choose just to purchase a licence to perform the play.
- Companies cannot pay less than the TNC/UKT rates on commission, delivery and acceptance; for rehearsal attendance; and for options for future performances.
- 3. If the play is non-commissioned, the company must pay the same fees and royalties it would have paid had the play been commissioned.
- 4. The text of the play cannot be changed without the playwright's permission. Any changes become part of the playwright's play. Playwrights cannot be asked to waive their moral rights.

- **5.** The playwright has the **right to attend all rehearsals** and to be paid for so doing.
- 6. The playwright is entitled to expenses for attending rehearsals and other duties relating to the production of the play.
- 7. The playwright has the **right of approval** of the choice of directors,
 designers and actors (while paying
 attention to the company's policy and
 resources). The playwright has the
 right to be consulted over publicity.
- 8. The company has the right to a proportion of the playwright's future earnings, but *only* after the playwright has earned a substantial amount from the subsequent productions of the play. The threshold figure is updated regularly and you can find the latest figures at www.writersguild.org.uk/rates-agreements/.
