

Did you know that WGGB (Writers' Guild of Great Britain) has a special fund held in trust for the sole purpose of helping members who experience urgent financial difficulties?

This money has been donated over many years by WGGB members, other individuals, and companies and organisations within the entertainment and cultural spheres with which WGGB has dealings.

An expert committee consisting of experienced WGGB members plus the WGGB Treasurer and General Secretary administers the Welfare Fund and takes decisions on applications for help.

Interest-free loans and/or grants are given to help WGGB Full members who cannot meet debt repayments or who have no money to pay business costs, household expenses or their WGGB subscriptions.

The Fund also helps when a WGGB member dies and relatives are left financially stranded.

Urgent assistance is sometimes needed and in such cases the Fund aims to respond within 48 hours. Applications can be handled by post, email or telephone.

In recent years the WGGB Welfare Fund has:

- Paid for special computer equipment needed by a disabled member.
 - Helped the widow of a world-famous writer who found herself without access to cash when he died.
 - Replaced an essential laptop for a member whose office was burgled.

If you need help from the WGGB Welfare Fund - or you know a member who does - please fill in the application form at the end of this document. To avoid disappointment please check the eligibility criteria below before applying for assistance.

Eligibility criteria

- The main focus of the Fund will be on emergencies and the unexpected.
- Grants and interest-free loans will be limited to £1,000.
- No member will be eligible for more than one application in any 12-month period.
- Subsequent applications, within five years, will only be granted in exceptional circumstances.
- The Fund will make interest-free loans or grants or pay subscriptions only for those who have been Full members of WGGB for at least two years immediately prior to the application.
- The Fund will not provide help to any Full member who is out of benefit as defined in the WGGB Rulebook, and this restriction will be mentioned in letters sent to members who are behind with their subscriptions.
- Where a member needs to buy a computer, only a standard, maximum grant/loan of £750 will be considered.
- The Fund does not pay tax bills.
- The Welfare Committee will not consider applications for ongoing liabilities.
